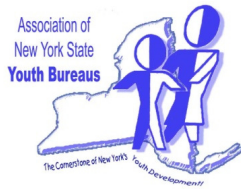
Making Your Work Count

Linking performance to successful outcomes helps maintain support of funders and the public by demonstrating that your programs get the results intended. Yet many Youth Bureaus, Child Welfare Agencies and other organizations have difficulty organizing data to help understand and communicate their impact in the community. This interactive workshop will provide an overview of Results-Based Accountability™ (RBA), a simple and effective framework for helping programs and service systems measure and improve their quality and effectiveness. RBA is based on a “change-agent” model that helps communities to align the efforts of various programs, service systems and strategies to more effectively impact results for children, families, adults and communities.

This workshop will introduce you to the tools and business systems necessary to optimize your organization’s current data, enabling you to turn data into information and to tell the story of your organization’s impact in a powerful way. Examples of how RBA is being used by Youth Bureaus, funders and other organizations in New York and across the country will be provided. Specifically, the workshop will introduce participants to a method to: 1) Achieve results through comprehensive community plans; 2) Identify the most powerful measures to tell the organization’s story; 3) Learn about the Results Scorecard™ Software that can be used to demonstrate impact and help to strategically plan for improvements.

Karen Finn is a Partner and Senior Consultant with the Results Leadership Group (RLG) based in Bethesda, Maryland. Finn has extensive experience in Results-Based Accountability (RBA), and performance metrics particularly in the areas of children, youth, family and health policy.
