

# 2010-11 Proposed TANF Reductions



The Governor's 2010-11 proposed budget recommendation includes significant reductions in funding for specific youth and family services including:

**Advantage After School** – elimination of \$10.9 million in TANF funds, leaving \$17.25 million in State General Funds;

**Home Visiting Program** – elimination of \$6 million in TANF funds, leaving \$15.7 million in state funding;



**Kinship Care** – elimination of \$1.99 million in TANF funds and 10% reduction in state funds, leaving \$677,500 for a program previously funded at \$1.9 million;

**Preventive Services Contracts** – eliminates \$18.8 million in TANF funds, but allow current contracts to expire at their original end dates, which range from June 2010 through March 2011.

**Community Reinvestment** – eliminates \$5 million in TANF funds;

**Summer Youth and Employment** – eliminates \$35 million for the entire program;

**Alternatives to Detention/Alternative Residential Placement** – eliminates \$10.75 million in TANF funds for alternatives to detention and residential diversion.
